Mission Statement

Our mission is to alleviate suffering in Ukraine. We do this by providing essential equipment and resources to empower children, students, the elderly, and internally displaced persons. By raising the quality of life for these vulnerable populations, we strive to create a brighter future for all Ukrainians, fostering resilience and recovery across the nation.



On 24 February 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine in a major escalation of the Russo-Ukrainian War, which started in 2014. The invasion, the largest conflict in Europe since World War II, has caused hundreds of thousands of military casualties, tens of thousands of Ukrainian civilian casualties, and left countless Ukrainians internally displaced. Russia began systematically targeting civilian infrastructure, leaving millions without light, heat and water.

In late November of that same year, Ukraine Power was born to help alleviate some of the suffering of the Ukrainians.

We are proud of what we have accomplished so far, but we are far from done. We are committed to our mission however long as it takes. Until Ukrainians are free. Until every light is back on.

Our Programmatic Pillars

1. We provide essential supplies so Ukrainians can continue their day-to-day lives, and deliver computers and tablets to allow children to continue their education. We help as many people as we are able by supplying generators, powerbanks, lights, heaters, computers and other basic goods to the 26 (and counting) community hubs.

2. We understand the best solution is to work to meet the needs directly. We partner with a variety of people, both government officials and civilians in Ukraine to understand what is needed, where it is needed, and respond as quickly as possible to those needs.

3. We target areas of high need. Through our partners in Ukraine, we learn of the needs of students, teachers, and local communities and move quickly to send what we can. Each delivery is verified with photos or videos.

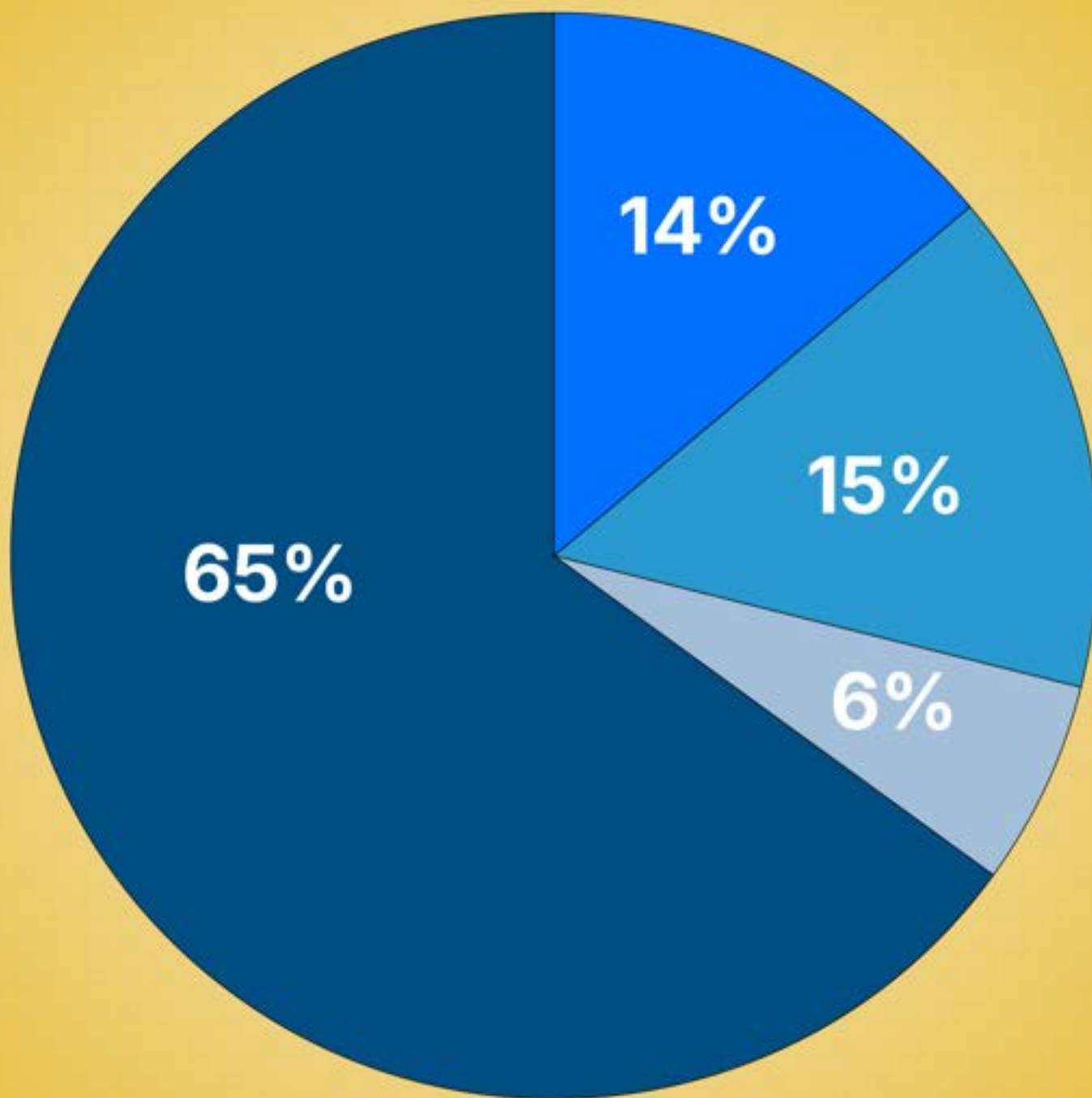
